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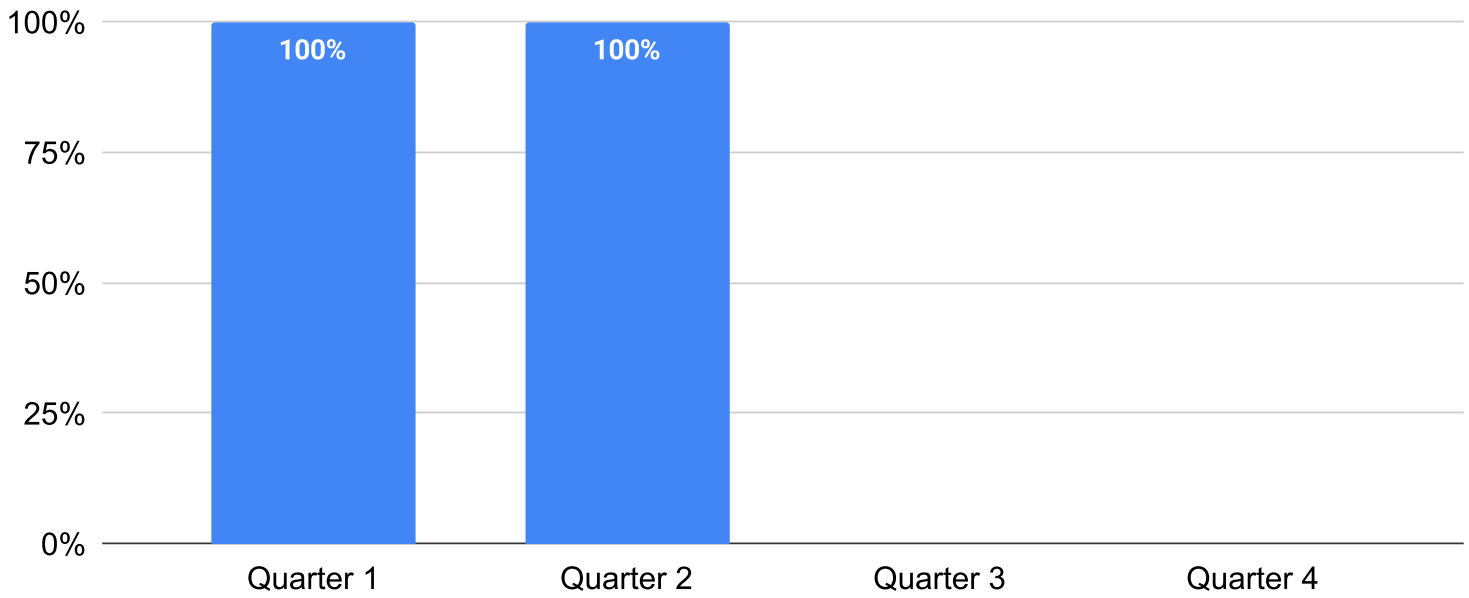
## Board Quarterly Monitoring Report for Triumph Public High Schools Lubbock (152803)

**Goal 1:** The percentage of graduates who will achieve college, career, or military readiness will increase from 22% (2021) to 70% by November 2026.

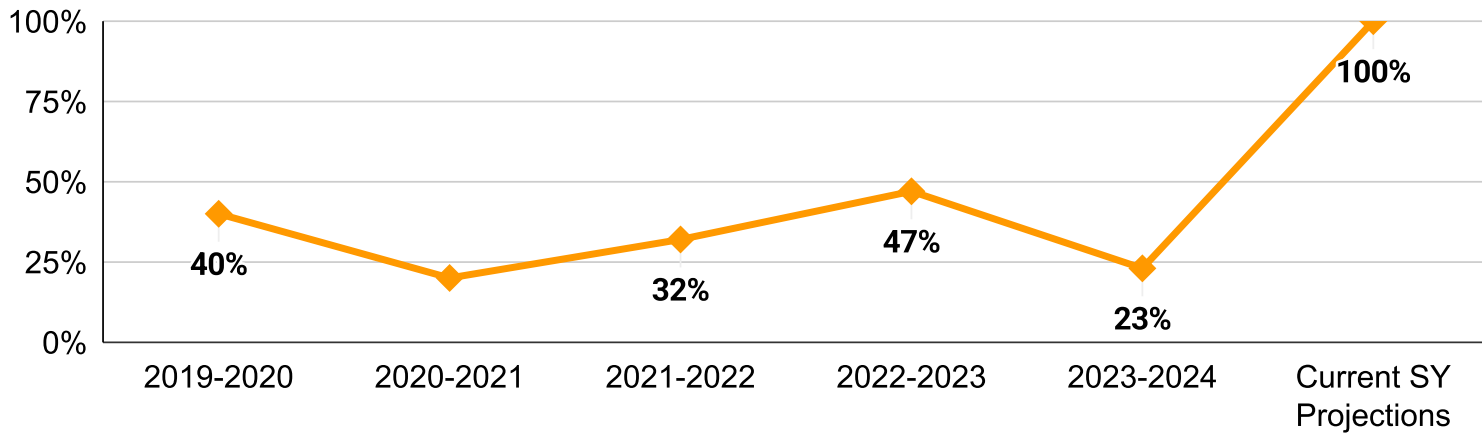

**The plan moving forward into next Quarter is to:**

- *CCMR Program Evaluations: A comprehensive evaluation of CCMR programs implemented during the Spring 2025 semester will be conducted. This will include an analysis of CCMR point attainment, TSI passing rates, FAFSA completion, and other key metrics.*
- *Professional Development: Training sessions will be organized for CCMR staff, SFSCs, and campus principals to enhance their knowledge and implementation of CCMR initiatives. These sessions will focus on CCMR coding updates to ensure accurate reporting, strategies for supporting underclassmen in their postsecondary planning, and a deeper understanding of the A-F Accountability System's impact on CCMR performance.*
- *Academic Counseling for Underclassmen: Efforts will shift toward supporting 9th through 11th-grade students in preparation for the next school year. Individualized success plans will be developed to align students with their chosen CCMR pathways, including dual credit, industry-based certifications, workforce development programs, and military pathways.*
- *PEIMS Data Audits: PEIMS audits will be conducted to ensure the accurate reporting of all CCMR indicators, including dual credit enrollment, TSI completion, IBC certifications, and FAFSA completions. Staff responsible for data entry will receive targeted training to enhance their understanding of CCMR coding procedures and compliance requirements.*
- *TSI Rollout: The TSI rollout will be strategically scheduled for May, after students have completed their STAAR EOC assessments, to optimize readiness and minimize testing fatigue. Priority will be given to 12th-grade students who still need to meet TSI requirements for CCMR points and 11th-grade students approaching readiness benchmarks.*
- *Exploring Alternatives to the Current IBC Program System: A review of the existing IBC program will be conducted to evaluate completion rates, workforce relevance, and overall impact on student outcomes. Alternative credentialing options will be researched to identify pathways that align with high-demand careers and local workforce needs.*
